CYCLE-5 YOUTH

The 160 new Inua youth have completed their first year in the Inua Training Program. These youth began their journey in the fall of 2021 with recruitment, and now, having completed their Life Skills Training, they have chosen their vocational paths, with some already starting internships with trainers specific to their chosen vocations. Rev. Paul has noted that there is something special about this group. They have a deep hunger to be catalysts for transformation in their communities. This cycle has truly embraced the benefits of the Inua program, and the staff is already witnessing remarkable changes.



NEIGHBORHOODS FOR CYCLE-5



Nutrition Intake on a Typical Day





I was doing casual work to help support my father and take care of my siblings by earning one or two dollars, though not every day. When I couldn't get work, I would go to local hairdressing salons to learn just by looking at what they were doing, because I could not pay for training.

Our 2022 event alone raised over \$28,000, bringing our six-year total to more than \$172,000 in support of Inua Partners in Hope. 






FINANCIAL REPORT

Funding sources for Inua include donations from individuals, churches, and businesses through the 5th Annual Inua 5K sponsorships, prayer partner pledges, Inua Sunday donations, and grants. In addition, the Inua Salon & Training Facility continues to grow as an income source for the program in Naivasha. Inua staff and board members continue to seek ways for the program to become self-sustaining.
